RAC GOLF COMMITTEE

Meeting Minutes – Club Room June 28, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 AM.

Members Present: Carolyn Bethea, Carolyn Clark, Joe Law, Marty O'Neill, Molly Walker, MaryAnn Wellander and Ron Larkin, Director of Golf.... Ted Roberts, Dave Lowe, and Dick Green were excused.

- 1. Meeting time was discussed. The time decided on was the last Wednesday of each month at 10:00 AM. All agreed that we were better to take a lesser meeting room in order to get the 10:00 AM time. Room will be announced.
- 2. All Committee members are continuing for another year of service. Three volunteers are "in the bank" in case of an opening during the year.
- 3. The bridge on hole 8 is being rebuilt and work should be finished by June 30th. Players are going directly from hole 6 to hole 9.
- 4. The only remaining 30+ year old bridge is between hole 5 and 6. This bridge is longer and has a steel beam supporting the main span... but the wood part of the structure does not inspire confidence in those crossing. Ron will review this and discuss it with senior management.
- 5. The Club is hosting the First Tee Summer Camp for the next several weeks. Supervision is provided by First Tee and the Club provides lunch and golf areas. After a week and a half, all is going well. The young golfers were displaced from Summerville Crossing due to a change in ownership...so maybe they are being exceptionally nice!!
- 6. Golf has very little publicity...partly due to lack of photos to post in the Atrium. Other activities have photo coverage. No solution for this was reached.
- 7. Wiring for the water sprinkler controllers was replaced and a new drinking fountain at the 12th green was replaced. Wiring job was completed with minimum disruption to the normal play.
- 8. Discussion of another clinic event resulted in recommendation to set it up for later in the Fall when the weather is more favorable.

- 9. The course has one or more areas where wild jungle was removed and no landscape was used to replace it. Committee feels that a project on the course should include both. For example, we do not have a plan to landscape the open area between number 13 tee and number 14 fairway where jungle was removed.
- 10. Committee agreed that a little more effort to finish jobs more completely would pay large dividends in appearance. A large downed tree limb dragged partly into the stream at the 5th tee box was used as an example of disregard for appearance.
- 11. The Committee Chair agreed to discuss with the Maintenance Committee Chair the use of maintenance work orders and/or Maintenance Committee representation to improve the visibility of golf course maintenance items. This will be reported at the next meeting.
- 12. Meeting was adjourned at 9:50 AM.
